

Chinese New Year – Secondary Calligraphy Competition

Chinese Calligraphy is the writing of Chinese characters in an art form. Chinese Calligraphy is also known as *shufa* (书法). A brush, *maobi* (毛笔) and ink, *mozhi*(墨汁) are the essential items used for writing calligraphy. During Chinese New Year, Chinese like to decorate their house with Spring Festival couplets, *chun lian* (春 联). These couplets are a pair of poetic line written vertically in black ink on red paper.

A Calligraphy competition was held among the secondary school students on the last day of school before Chinese New Year. Students were required to write a Spring Festival Couplets and the best 3 of each form were selected and displayed at the main lobby of the campus.



Primary School

"Teka Gambar"

Pembelajaran kali ini adalah dengan mengaplikasikan pembelajaran abad ke-21 iaitu "Teka Gambar". Tajuk pelajarannya ialah Kata Nama Am, dimana ia merupakan salah satu aspek tatabahasa yang amat penting dan perlu dikuasai oleh murid-murid. Objektif pembelajaran adalah untuk menguji pengetahuan sedia ada bagi murid-murid Tahun 3 tentang kata nama am. Selain itu, murid boleh mengenal pasti sekurang-kurangnya tiga kata nama am dengan betul. Oleh itu, guru membuat pendekatan berbeza dengan membuat aktiviti meneka gambar yang dilukis oleh mereka sendiri.

Bagi sesi induksi, guru menunjukkan paparan video tentang kata nama am. Murid diminta untuk menumpukan perhatian sepenuhnya kerana aktiviti yang akan dijalankan berkait rapat dengan video tersebut. Murid memberikan respons yang baik dan penuh bersemangat.

Selepas menonton tayangan video tersebut, guru memberikan beberapa helai kertas kajang dan mereka berbaris mengikut susunan yang telah diberikan. Guru memastikan penjarakan sosial di antara murid semasa aktiviti dijalankan.



Guru menerangkan peraturan permainan kepada murid. Pertama, murid hendaklah melukis kata nama am yang ditunjukkan oleh guru kepada murid pertama. Kemudian, murid tersebut perlu menunjukkan hasil lukisan kepada murid yang kedua tanpa memberitahu perkataan yang perlu dilukis. Arahan hanya boleh diberikan dalam bentuk lukisan sahaja dan masa yang diberikan adalah 1 minit sahaja. Permainan diteruskan sehingga murid yang terakhir, dimana murid terakhir perlu melukis dan meneka kata nama am tersebut.










Primary School – "Teka Gambar"




Reka Bentuk dan Teknologi
